LITURGY FOR THE DEPARTURE OF A PASTOR

(The congregation sitting, the departing pastor stands.)

Pastor Doug Rights, on Sunday, August 27, 2017, you were installed as our pastor to proclaim God's Word, to baptize and welcome new members into the church of Jesus Christ, to announce God's forgiveness to us, and to officiate at our celebrations of Holy Communion. We do, with God's help.

Do you offer encouragement for his ministry as it unfolds in his new situation?

We do, with God's help.

(The following questions are addressed to the departing pastor.)

Doug, as you conclude your service as pastor of this congregation, do you release the leaders and members of King Moravian Church from turning to you and depending on you?

I do, with God's help.

Do you offer your prayers and encouragement for God's ongoing work here?

I do, with God's help.

Though you are no longer our pastor, you remain our brother in Christ. We will uphold you in our prayers as you begin this new chapter in your life of service and ongoing ministry. We pledge our support and love to you and wish you God's blessing.
